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Summary: What did Christ mean when he said workers of iniquity, and who to enter Heaven.

To start with let's go over, what the term "workers of iniquity" means. as mentioned on many occasions, many of the psalms contain this term and much of what Yeshua stated, is to add too the already existing text of the Paul would have us believe, when he says Christ ended the law, and that veil over it unless we have Christ, as it is God who illuminates. Isaiah 31:1-3 Woe to those who go down to Egypt for help, and lean on him because it is great; and in horsemen, because they are so very strong, by the Holy One of Israel, nor do they seek Jehovah! (2) Yet He also is wise, not call back His Words, but will arise against the house of evil-doers and who work iniquity. (3) And Egypt is a man, and not God; and their horses are men. When Jehovah shall stretch out His hand, both he who helps shall fall, and he who is helped shall fall down, and they shall all cease together.

Unless you have a veil over your head when you read this, to me it seems that we should have trust in God and not man, as for centuries this has been easier to worship man, than God who is spirit.

This is one account of this from the Old Testament, yet if you do a search with the same context, that we should have trust and faith in God.

Quote:

Matthew 7:21-23 Not everyone who says to Me, Lord! Lord! Shall enter the kingdom of heaven. (22) Many will say to me we not prophesy in your name, and through your name throw out demons, do many wonderful works? (23) And then I will say to them I never knew you workers of iniquity!

This is the clearest reference spoken by Yeshua and this is clear that he
him, yet to do the work of the father. Now as you can see from other texts
but God.

Quote:

Titus 2:13-14 looking for the blessed hope, and the appearance of the glory of our great God and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Savior Yeshua Christ, (14) who gave Himself for us that He might redeem us, purify to Himself a special people, zealous of good works.

This written by Paul is a perfect example of what a worker of iniquity is, Yeshua is a sin offering, yet refers to him as God, making it that God controls his image, so breaking the second commandment.

Quote:

Psalms 14:4 have all the workers of iniquity not known, eating up my people, they have not called on Jehovah.

This psalm is a perfected example of Paul, as when I used it in another context, it seems to apply here. In this psalm, it says that the non-Christians who do good, he seems to have been blinded to the fact, it says the same thing about the Christians after with that non call on God and we can begin to see why between him and God there is a great divide.

Quote:

Psalms 28:3-4 Draw me not away with the wicked, and with the workers of iniquity lead me not. For their hands have shed blood, and their fingers have dipped in the blood of the righteous, to their neighbors, yet evil is in their hearts. (4) Give them according to the wickedness of their practices, give them according to the work of their hands, for they deserve.

This psalm underlines the fact that it is through works and how we behave that God's grace can cover us. They have established, what is referred to as the foundation of the whole Christian religion. This is why in Revelations it is referred to as the Great Harlot, as not only has Rome been the beginning of all the churches, it has spread its influence around the world, as if truth. When clearly it is anti-Christ and against God's commandments given to Moses. By giving our hearts to a different God and worshipping that image this is what the bible refers to as prostitution.

Quote:

Luke 13:25-27 And once the (master) =head of the house has risen up and you begin to stand outside and to knock at the door, saying, Lord, Lord, answer and say to you, I do not know you; from where are you; (26) then he will say to you, Depart from me, you workers of iniquity.

Here you will notice, I have edited it master for head as it can be in Greek. The master is the head of the house. This then makes slightly more sense of what it means, as now the master is God, yet the person who is letting people in, is not Yeshua. This is Yeshua referring to another, thus meaning it is up to God, who is allowed into heaven.
