

Title: Conversations

Subtitle: Which Lord is David referring to in Psalms 110:1?

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The Spirit of God (YHVH) is speaking to David, and calling David the Lord straight after it appoints him as being of the Order of Melchizedek (Psalms 110:1-4).

In Psalms 89:19-21 David is appointed as a holy vessel to be the anointed Lord; which we see paraphrased in Isaiah 52:13-14.

When the Spirit of Salvation (Yeshua) is placed into the flesh of David (110:1), the language barriers that make it confusing; especially them changing his name (H5580 *jesus* = shall be a beast & G5580 *psudeo-Christos* = false Christ).

It is like when God spoke at Yeshua's Baptism by John, it says "This is my Son, whom I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:13-17; Mark 1:9-11; Luke 3:21-23).

There are multiple places in the Tanakh, David is ultimately the Messiah. Yeshua has to be David with the Spirit of the Lord upon him.
