Eze 29:3-9 Speak and say, So says the Lord Jehovah: Behold, I, even I, the king of Egypt (man), the great dragon who lies in the midst of his rivers, mine, and I have made it. (4) But I will put hooks in your jaws, and I will make you to stick to your scales, and I will bring you up out of the midst of your rivers. Your rivers shall stick to your scales. (5) And I will leave you to the wilderness; your rivers shall be dry. You shall fall on the open fields; you shall not be removed nor gathered for food to the beasts of the field and to the birds of the heavens. (6) And they shall know that I am Jehovah, because they have been a staff of reed to them. When they took you by your hand, you broke and tore off all their shoulders. You, you shattered and made all their loins stand. (8) So the Lord Jehovah will bring a sword on you, and cut off man and beast from you. (9) And they shall be a desert and waste; and they shall know that I am Jehovah, because he has said so, and I have made it.

I have added Egypt is man; as explain in another part of the Bible. So this explains that the dragon is something that portrays it self as God. Now according to the book of John (which is made up), Christ made the universe as said by Christ and he wouldn't dare say so.
