To start with let's find out what these words mean taken from the Strong's

Why is there only one reference to it?

If in nearly every reference, God makes stuff simple; so this is saying it is only one reference in the whole Bible?

So this made no logical sense, so after looking for the actual context of the word it implies to the snare and the mystery running throughout the Bible.

From H6555; violent, that is, a tyrant: - destroyer, ravenous, robber.

So when this word turns up in every major prophet speech on exactly the same thing, it makes far more logical sense, that this is the word being used, especially in the scriptures, pertain to the same thing.

Now though I could add my own summaries to each of these, explain that the word, is what it is referred to as the "destroyer" in all of these.

This basically means most Christianity ideology which doesn't follow Christ. Pharisees as a word; not a "Nazarenes" or "followers of the way" as when Christ came (divine priesthood).

So Christ stands and stood against these doctrines according to what is provable Anti-Christ doctrine, as explained in the other articles.

So where you find the word destroyer added, this is taken from the Hebrew scriptures above.

So if you look at the context of these knowing who it referring to it sort of makes sense with out adding to.

Jer 7:1-34 The Word that came to Jeremiah from Jehovah, saying, (2) Thus says Jehovah, the God of Israel, saying, Hear ye the words of this covenant which I made with your fathers, saying, Hear ye the words of Jehovah, and declare there this Word, and say, Hear the Word of Jehovah, and enter in at these gates to worship Jehovah. (3) So says Jehovah of Hosts, the God of Israel, saying, your ways and your doings good, and I will cause you to dwell in this place. (4) Thus says Jehovah, saying, the temple of Jehovah, The temple of Jehovah, The temple of Jehovah, For if you thoroughly amend your ways and your doings; if you completely amend your ways, man and his neighbour; (6) if you do not oppress the stranger, the fatherless, nor shed innocent blood in this place, nor walk after other gods to your hurt, then will I cause you to dwell in this place, in the land that I gave to your fathers, forever and ever. (7) Lying words that cannot do any good. (9) Will you steal, murder, and commit adultery, and swear falsely, and burn incense to Baal, and walk after other gods whom you do not know, and come and stand before Me in this house which is called by My name, and do all these abominations? (11) Has this house, which is called by My name, become a robbers (destroyer) in your eyes? Behold, I also have seen, says Jehovah, this place which was in Shiloh, where I set My name at the first, and see what I have done to the wickedness of My people Israel. (13) And now, because you have done all these things, says Jehovah, and I spoke to you, rising up early and speaking, but you did not listen, you did not answer; (14) therefore I will do to this house, which is called by My name, and to the place which I gave to you and to your fathers, as I have said, and will cast you out of My sight, as I have cast out all your brothers, the whole house of Israel. Therefore do not pray for this people, nor lift up cry nor prayer for them, for I will not hear you. (17) Do you not see what they do in the cities of Judah, and in Jerusalem? (18) The sons gather wood, and the fathers kindle the fire, and they burn dough, to make cakes to the queen of heaven and to pour out drink offerings thereunto, and may provoke Me to anger. (19) Do they vex Me? says Jehovah. Is it not because they have hated My words, of their own faces? (20) Therefore so says the Jehovah God; Behold, I will be poured out on this place, on man, and on animal, and on the trees of the ground; and it shall burn, and shall not be put out. (21) So says Jehovah, the God of Israel: Put your burnt offerings to your sacrifices, and eat flesh. (22) For I have not commanded your fathers, nor command them in the day that I brought them out of the land of Egypt, saying, Offer burnt offerings or sacrifices. (23) But I commanded them this thing, saying, C

your God, and you shall be my people; and walk in all the ways that I have commanded you, and it may be well with you. (24) But they did not listen, nor bow their ear, in the stubbornness of their evil heart, and went backward and not forward. (25) Your fathers came out of the land of Egypt until this day I have even sent unto you prophets, daily rising up early and sending. (26) Yet they did not listen to my voice, nor ear, but hardened their neck. They did worse than their fathers. (27) So I have spoken words to them, but they will not listen to you; you shall also call to them, but they will not hear. (28) But you shall say to them, this is a nation which does not obey the law, nor receives instruction; truth has perished, and is cut off from their mouth, and they have thrown it away, and take up a weeping on the high places. For Jehovah has kindled the generation of His wrath. (30) For the sons of Judah have done evil in My sight. They have set their abominations in the house which is called by My name, and have built the high places of Tophet, which is in the valley of the sons of Hinnom, and they have burned their sons and their daughters in the fire; which I did not command them, nor have I spoken. (32) So, behold, the days come, says Jehovah, that it shall no more be called the valley of the son of Hinnom, but the Valley of Slaughter. For they shall bury in it, and shall burn bones in that place. (33) And the bodies of this people shall be food for the birds of the air, and for the beasts of the earth; and none shall frighten them away. (34) Then I will cease from the cities of Judah and from the streets of Jerusalem, and from the voice of the bridegroom, and the voice of the bride. For the land shall be desolate.
