Second Subtitle: The Errors in 'God: An Anatomy'

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The problem with the analysis is that El (H410) and Elohim (H430) have been separated since Babylon (Isaiah 46:9).

Where Isaiah 46:9 uses the same language of 'going back to the former time' of Deuteronomy 32:7-9; that El Elyon (God Most High) separated the nation from the Divine Council, and gave the nation of Israel to YHVH.

Elohim (H433) refers to a Divine Being, and El (H410) refers to the Source of reality added to the word, means something breathed into existence by the Source.

YHVH is a Hebrew translation of the Sanskrit 'Bhagavan Brahma', where Bhagavan come from the root 'breath', and mean 'to be', 'to make manifest' i.e the Source.

In many theological structures globally there is the Source of reality, and the Divine Beings/Avatars/Archangels who've interacted with the reality.

Because after Babylon the Jews tried to create a stricter form of monotheism, and contexts to be henothistic instead.

We can show in David's Psalms he declares YHVH, 'and' El Elyon in these Psalms:

2 Samuel 22:14 & Psalms 18:13, Psalms 21:7, Psalms 50:14, Psalms 78:35

We can show in Job he declares a Divine Being (Elohim - H433), 'and' the Lamb of God.

Job 5:17, Job 6:4, Job 11:7, Job 22:26, Job 27:10, Job 31:2, Job 40:2

The book of Revelation also tries to fix the theology of God Almighty (El Elyon) on the throne, and then the 24 Elders are Elohim, plus the Lamb as the king of the world.

The idea of Divine Beings (Elohim) having a form, and man being made in their image, doesn't defile the 2nd commandment. The Source of reality is being panentheistic, whereas the Divine Council are pantheistic.
